


Student Spring 2022 Guide to the Library

Please respect these policies so that we can make the Library a safe, productive and welcoming space for all!



BOOKS & ARTICLES

The Library has nearly 2 million books and over 40 thousand newspapers, magazines, and journals, many of which you can read online. Use the OneSearch discovery tool right on the library home page to search for required readings, background information on a new subject, an article in a specific journal, or even a book to read for fun!

TEXTBOOKS & RESERVES

New textbooks can be really expensive! Many professors request that textbooks, required readings, or class assignments be placed "on Reserve" for their classes. If your professor has put something on Reserve, you can see them in OneSearch and then request these materials in the Reserve Reading Room on the first floor. Books on Reserve can be checked out for two hours, and must be used in the Library.

If your textbook is not on reserve in the Library, or if you want to purchase (or rent) your own copy, check out these resources on how to save money on textbooks.

Computing at the Library

PUBLIC COMPUTER LABS

The Library has hundreds of computers with internet and academic and design software applications that you can use to check email, look for books and articles, work on papers and assignments, use specialized software, scan, and print.

- 2nd floor New Media Center

LIBRARY CAFE

The Morton and Angela Topfer Library Café has 80 computers, all with internet, academic and design software applications, full printing and scanning services, multiple study and lounge areas, expert and caring technical support, and a coffee kiosk! Located in the ground floor of Whitehead Hall the Library Café offers extended hours.

WIFI, COMPUTER & PRINTING ACCOUNTS

Use these credentials to log onto computers and print in the Library and the WEBlab, as well as campus WiFi

Username: 8-digit CUNYFirst EmplID

Password: your First and Last initials (upper case), 6-digit month, day, and year of your birthday with the slashes "/" in this format: FLMM/DD/YY

PRINTING

- Printers are available in all Library computer labs and by Circulation.
- All students receive a credit balance (Quota) for printing: Undergrads up to \$15 per semester; Grad students up to \$30 per semester.
- Printing Costs: Black & White printing costs \$0.10/single-sided page and \$0.15/double-sided page. Color printing costs \$0.50/page using Debit funds (cash only).
- Adding Funds: Patron Kiosks are located at the New Media Center desk on the 2nd floor and at the Circulation desk on the 1st floor.

Computing at the Library (cont'd)

SCANNERS

There are self-service scanners available in all Library computer labs and the Library Cafe. There is no charge for scanning. If there is a line we ask that you limit yourself to 20 minutes.

LAPTOP LOANS

Laptops are available to current BC students on a first come, first served basis. A valid Brooklyn College ID and another valid photo ID such as a driver's license are required to borrow a laptop.

Laptops are available for same-day loan or 3-day loan. Grad students may borrow PC laptops for up to 30 days. Mac Books are available to all students for same-day loans. Laptops must be checked out from the New Media Center and returned to the New Media Center no later than 30 minutes before closing on the due date.

GROUP STUDY ROOMS

There are group study rooms on every floor of the Library; each is outfitted with whiteboards and screen sharing technology for your use.

Group study rooms have a two-person minimum, and in Spring 2022 a four-person maximum, and are assigned for a 2-hour period. Students may reserve a group study room at the New Media Center (2nd floor) with a valid BC ID.

No eating is allowed in study rooms.

WORKSHOPS

Need to create a spreadsheet for an assignment? Want to use PowerPoint for your awesome presentation? The Library and Library Café offer free, drop-in technology-based workshops throughout the year. These hands-on workshops cover software such as Microsoft Excel, PowerPoint, and Word; Adobe Photoshop Illustrator and InDesign; and QuickBooks and SPSS.




Library Locations

- Reserves – professors place high-demand course material here


2ND FLOOR

- Stacks call numbers A-N


